Living Flame Workshop Facilitators (in alphabetical order)

1. Lesley O'Connor

Lesley lives in County Waterford, Ireland. Centering Prayer found her in 2007 and since then it has played a pivotal part in her life. Her working career was driven by human rights concerns for people marginalised due to intellectual disabilities. A commissioned presenter of Centering Prayer and *Lectio Divina*, Lesley leads retreats. She served on the Advisory Circle of Contemplative Outreach Dublin. Lesley was the first team lead of the Global Team serving English speaking practitioners of Centering Prayer outside the United States. She currently serves on the *Lectio Divina* Service Team. Lesley is trained in Spiritual Accompaniment. She has completed an MA in Applied Spirituality with *Visio Divina* as the focus of her research thesis. She volunteers as a coach in transformational leadership with The Mastery Foundation, an organization co-founded by Fr. Basil Pennington O.C.S.O., empowering those engaged in ministry and In reconciliation.

2. Marilyn Webb

Marilyn Webb has been practicing centering prayer since the early 1990's. She has been active in the Indianapolis chapter since its formation in 2007 and was coordinator from 2008 to 2013. During that time the chapter held Living Flame 1 and 2 programs in 2009-2011. Marilyn is a commissioned presenter of Centering Prayer and currently serves Contemplative Outreach Ltd. as the national team leader for the Living Flame program. Marilyn is a spiritual director, a lay Associate of the Sisters of Providence in St. Mary-of-the-Woods, IN and is active in the Association of Contemplative Women.

3. Mary Dwyer

Mary Dwyer is a long-time student of Fr. Thomas Keating and has been practicing Centering Prayer for over twenty years. In the early 1990's, she lived at Chrysalis House, a contemplative live-in community experiment blessed by Fr. Thomas. Her housemates included Mary Mrozowski, David Frenette and Cathy McCarthy. The community lived according to a rule of life, and became an incubator of practice and programs in the early years of Contemplative Outreach's growth. It was her experience at Chyrsalis House – what she refers to as her "inpatient" or "residential treatment time" – that proved to her that a life of prayer, consent and practice is real, stable and deeply rewarding. Mary Mrozowski taught her that a devoted life of prayer was the real work of life; what we did the rest of the time was just how we made a living.

Mary received her undergraduate degree from Georgetown University in economics and spent some time as a banker and college administrator. After a few years at Chrysalis House, she went back to school and became a licensed clinical social worker and practiced this vocation for the next 15 years, all while maintaining her commitment to the contemplative life and to the mission of Contemplative Outreach. In 2008 she met her beloved Juan through the Living Flame program. She moved to Miami, FL in 2009 and they married.

Mary is a former Chairperson of the Contemplative Outreach Faculty. She is the most recent past Coordinator for the Living Flame program and a member of the Welcoming Prayer Service Team. Mary devotes her time to giving retreats and workshops on behalf of Contemplative Outreach throughout the US and internationally.

Nancy has been practicing Centering Prayer since 1998. She is a Commissioned Presenter for Centering Prayer, the Forgiveness Prayer and 12 Step Outreach. Nancy has served with the Formation Training of Centering Prayer Introductory Workshop Presenters for the past three years. She received her undergraduate degree from Penn State University and after working for twenty-five years as a Recreation Therapist she felt a call to study with Oasis Ministries. She is a graduate of their Spiritual Direction for Spiritual Guides and Deepening Year of Direction Ministries Programs and has offered Spiritual Direction since 2007. She has led retreats at Bethany Retreat Center since 2004. Currently, she serves as Co-Coordinator of Contemplative Outreach of Central Pa. She is passionate about the Forgiveness Prayer and awed daily by its inner workings in her life.

5. Nancy Stimac

Nancy Stimac, a longtime contemplative prayer practitioner, serves on the Contemplative Outreach Ltd. Lectio Divina Service Team and is a commissioned presenter of Centering Prayer and Lectio Divina. While winding down careers in education and advertising, after completing six years of study, she received certification in the Archdiocese of Hartford's Catholic Bible School and Lay Ministry programs. In 2019 she was certified to teach "Making Sense of the Bible" for the Catholic Biblical School. She uses her gifts serving the Catholic community of Windsor Locks, facilitating prayer groups and Bible studies, lectoring, and working on RCIA and evangelization team programs. She and her optometrist husband George reside in Windsor, CT with eight animal companions. They have a grown son who lives in Dracut, MA.

6. Richard J. Bonacci

Richard's interest in the Desert Ammas and Abbas has roots in both his academic career as well as his training in spiritual direction.
